An Act relating to the Department of Corrections; requiring that portions of certain appropriated funds be used for certain purposes; requiring certain coordination; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

**HB 3707** – By Wallace and Casey of the House and David and Fields of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services; requiring that portions of certain appropriated funds be used for certain purposes; requiring that certain payment rates be increased by certain percentage; authorizing requests for early transfers of certain funds for specific purposes; providing for lapse of funds under certain conditions requiring certain budget procedures; prohibiting certain budget procedures; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
