## First Regular Session of the Fifty-seventh Legislature of the State of Oklahoma Eleventh Legislative Day, Tuesday, February 19, 2019

## **MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE**

Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HBs 1257, 1259, 1988** and **2642**.

**HB 1257** – By Hilbert of the House and Stanislawski of the Senate.

An Act relating to counties and county officers; amending 19 O.S. 2011, Section 971, which relates to county employee's retirement systems; eliminating certain employer contribution cap; and providing an effective date.

**HB 1259** – By Hilbert of the House and Paxton and Montgomery of the Senate.

An Act relating to elections; amending 26 O.S. 2011, Sections 7-109 and 14-107, which relate to conduct of elections; allowing disclosure of certain ballots by specific means; making certain acts unlawful; providing penalties; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**HB 1988** – By Nollan of the House and Haste of the Senate.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.545, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 131, O.S.L. 2017 (70 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 1210.545), which relates to annual accountability reports; removing directive to grant certain exemption for chronic absenteeism; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2642** – By Baker, Munson and Lawson of the House and Rosino of the Senate.

An Act relating to children; establishing the Oversight Committee on the Delivery of Child Welfare Services; providing for duties; providing for membership; providing for appointment of cochairs; authorizing staff assistance; requiring certain report; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.
