MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HBs 1107, 1228, 1780, 2270 and 2289**.

HB 1107 – By West (Kevin) of the House and Leewright of the Senate.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Sections 1327, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 16, O.S.L. 2016 and 1332, as last amended by Section 5, Chapter 161, O.S.L. 2017 (59 O.S. Supp. 2018, Sections 1327 and 1332), which relate to bail bondsmen; specifying rate for certain travel costs borne by bail bondsmen; requiring certain computerized records be without limitation and accessible to law enforcement agencies nationwide; and providing an effective date.

HB 1228 – By Sanders, Albright, West (Josh), Boles, Townley and Lawson of the House and Smalley of the Senate.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 6-194, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 246, O.S.L. 2015 (70 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 6-194), which relates to professional development programs; requiring annual training program for dyslexia awareness; listing components of training program; and providing an effective date.

HB 1780 – By McCall, Baker, Roberts (Sean), Lawson and McBride of the House and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to teacher compensation; amending Section 3, Chapter 394, O.S.L. 2013, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 10, 2nd Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 2018 (70 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 18-114.14), which relates to the Minimum Salary Schedule; modifying the Minimum Salary Schedule for certified personnel; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2270 – By West (Josh) and Roberts (Dustin) of the House and Kidd of the Senate.

An Act relating to children; amending 10 O.S. 2011, Sections 7700-102, 7700-308 and 7700-607, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 96, O.S.L. 2014 (10 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 7700-607), which relates to the Uniform Parentage Act; modifying definition; modifying grounds for challenging acknowledgement of paternity; adding exception to limitations of paternity actions; and providing an effective date.

HB 2289 – By Wright of the House and Howard of the Senate.

An Act relating to liens; amending 42 O.S. 2011, Section 91, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 316, O.S.L. 2016 (42 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 91), which relates to liens on personal property; terminating requirements for notarization of certain documents; and providing an effective date.
