Seventeenth Legislative Day, Thursday, February 28, 2019

REPORT OF ENGROSSED AND ENROLLED MEASURES

SBs 536, 538, 539, 540, 603, 752, 876 and 885 were each correctly engrossed, properly signed and ordered transmitted to the Honorable House for consideration.

MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HBs 1210, 1212, 1295, 1940, 2010** and **2253**.

HB 1210 – By Newton of the House and Jech of the Senate.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 1115, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 337, O.S.L. 2012 (47 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 1115), which relates to motor vehicle registration; modifying registration schedule for certain vehicles; and providing an effective date.

HB 1212 – By Newton of the House and Jech of the Senate.

An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 150.23, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 86, O.S.L. 2018 (74 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 150.23), which relates to custody of sidearm and badge upon retirement or death; providing peace officers of the Department of Corrections the option to purchase firearm prior to retirement; and providing an effective date.

HB 1295 – By Miller of the House and Simpson of the Senate.

An Act relating to information technology expenditures; amending 62 O.S. 2011, Section 34.12, as last amended by Section 3, Chapter 384, O.S.L. 2017 (62 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 34.12), which relates to duties of the Information Services Division of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services; authorizing the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs to make certain purchases without regard to certain requirements; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 1940 – By Strom and Caldwell (Trey) of the House and Hicks of the Senate.

An Act relating to school attendance; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 10-106, which relates to compulsory attendance; excusing absence due to school-approved activities and approved extracurricular activities; authorizing absence for other reason deemed appropriate by school district; and providing an effective date.

HB 2010 – By Mize of the House and David of the Senate.

An Act relating to firearms; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1277, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 247, O.S.L. 2018 (21 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 1277), which relates to the unlawful carrying of firearms in certain places; authorizing the carry of certain weapons on certain property; providing an exception; and providing an effective date.

HB 2253 – By Goodwin of the House and Bice of the Senate.

An Act relating to elections; amending 26 O.S. 2011, Section 4-101, which relates to voter registration; clarifying conditions for voter eligibility; and providing an effective date.
