Twenty-sixth Legislative Day, Monday, March 18, 2019

MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HBs 1161, 1426, 1979, 1985, 2019, 2358, 2367, 2465 and 2604.**

HB 1161 – By Worthen of the House and McCortney of the Senate.
An Act relating to firearms; amending Section 3, Chapter 259, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S.

Supp. 2018, Section 1290.27), which relates to the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act; authorizing transmission of certain information by using electronic methods or data exchange; and providing an effective date.

HB 1426 – By Loring, May, Kiger and Luttrell of the House and McCortney of the Senate.

An Act relating to public retirement systems; amending 62 O.S. 2011, Section 3103, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 245, O.S.L. 2018 (62 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 3103), which relates to the Oklahoma Pension Legislation Actuarial Analysis Act; modifying definition; amending 11 O.S. 2011, Sections 49-100.1, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 388, O.S.L. 2013, 49-103, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 36, O.S.L. 2016 and 49-104 (11 O.S. Supp. 2018, Sections 49-100.1 and 49-103), which relate to the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement System; modifying definitions; providing for membership by certain firefighters employed by federally recognized Native American tribes; modifying provisions related to local retirement boards; providing for service in designated capacities with respect to federally recognized Native American tribes; and providing effective dates.

HB 1979 – By Ranson of the House and Rader of the Senate.

An Act relating to public health and safety; creating the TBI Task Force; stating purpose; providing for composition and appointment of members; providing members serve without compensation; providing for meetings; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1985 – By Lepak and Caldwell (Chad) of the House and Bergstrom of the Senate.
[insurance - Educators' Professional Liability Insurance Program - Office of Management and Enterprise Services]

HB 2019 – By Albright and Davis of the House and Kirt of the Senate.

[criminal procedure - directing courts to determine certain status of accused persons when considering pretrial release - effective date]

HB 2358 – By Meredith of the House and Pemberton of the Senate.

[public safety - driver licenses - allowing appropriate agencies to receive photographs through certain electronic systems - effective dates]

HB 2367 – By Kannady of the House and Daniels of the Senate.

[workers' compensation - amending various statutes relating to workers' compensation - emergency]

HB 2465 – By Dunnington of the House and Rosino of the Senate.

An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 840-2.15, which relates to the Oklahoma Personnel Act; prohibiting requiring use of compensatory time if sick leave is available; requiring payment of overtime for certain employees; and providing an effective date.

HB 2604 – By Echols of the House and Bice of the Senate.
[children - directing Department of Human Services to create a perpetrator registry -
effective date]
