## First Regular Session of the Fifty-seventh Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

**Fifty-sixth Legislative Day, Monday, May 13, 2019**

The Senate was called to order by Senator Daniels.

An Act relating to confidentiality of records; amending Section 2, Chapter 389, O.S.L. 2015 (22 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 60.31), which relates to family justice centers;

expanding authority of family justice centers to assist victims of certain crimes; requiring establishment and maintenance of certain consent policy; providing for confidentiality of certain records; defining term; establishing exception to confidentiality requirement under certain circumstances; establishing exception to certain consent requirements; construing provisions; requiring compliance with laws governing certain professions; and providing an effective date.
