Sixtieth Legislative Day, Friday, May 17, 2019

Supp. 2018, Section 4258), which relates to the Ethics Commission Fund; limiting annual deposits to Fund; providing for deposit of collections in excess of limit; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2746 – By Wallace and Hilbert of the House and Thompson and Rader of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Digital Transformation Program Revolving Fund; designating the nature of the fund; declaring fund monies appropriated; providing and limiting purpose of expenditure; requiring certain expenditure and budgetary procedures; requiring certain periodic reporting of certain information to certain individuals; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.
